And I certainly did not see the chair being hurled off of the bleachers toward my body as I conducted PE class with 55 boys in the HOPE High School Gymnasium. Obviously I am an outstanding coach as it takes great training to throw a pencil, an orange, and especially a chair with that much accuracy!!!

On that Friday in August in 2007, when my former coach called me letting me know that his son Kole Knueppel would be giving me a call to see if I was interested in being the PE instructor at The HOPE School on Martin Luther King Drive in Milwaukee, Wisconsin I don't think even I could have imagined how challenging Urban Educational Ministry would be. I had dreamed of being the head varsity coach at HOPE High School and I immediately said yes to the \$100 a day salary.

So on Monday morning I drove from 82nd and Center to Martin Luther King Drive and I distinctly remember the drive from over 11 years ago today. I often listen to music or talk radio or often the Bible as I drive across town. On this day it was silent as I contemplated the reality of teaching and not knowing a single kid, minus one I had once coached against. It was a daunting task and I knew that it was going to be difficult. But even I in that quiet moment could not have imagined the challenges I would face over the next 11 years. Oh I had Urban Education experience before. And I had faced some very challenging Ministries. But it is safe to say that those years at HOPE were among the most raw and pure ministry I have ever experienced. And I loved it!!!

I don't remember if I truly understood this on that quiet, humble, reflective ride into Milwaukee on that summer morning, despite feeling very alone and ill-equiped to be successful, in truth I had the few things you need to be successful in Urban Educational Ministry.

No college class, no book you read, few life experiences, and no 1 hour session will prepare you for Urban Educational Ministry... But it starts with knowing who you are...




# Coach Lance Meyer

**Enrollment 2017-2018** 







- 3. Village concept "each on reach one". We can't do this alone, everyone has to have the mindset that small progress is worthy of celebration just as well as big wins. Being able to relate and celebrate!
- 4. Know this is Gods work and he determines when the transformations happen, we plant the seeds, continue to water them and then sit back and watch the transformation happen. Sometimes we may not get to see them yet we trust that we have done what were called to do on a daily basis.

### The Parable of the Lost Sheep

**15** Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering around to hear Jesus. 2 But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

3 Then Jesus told them this parable: 4 "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? 5 And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders 6 and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' 7 I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.
