

Enter WISEdata

In 2012 the state of Wisconsin started the WISEdata initiative with the goal of collecting and maintain comprehensive, high-quality education data from all K-12 public and private schools in Wisconsin.

This would open the door for better data quality and consistency, accountability and transparency in the department of education and ease in making data-driven decisions for the future.

Private schools benefit by:

- Improved access to state and federal funding.
- Improves access to professional development and inter-data cooperation.

Helpful Hints/Tips

- Use Student ID integration to pull WISEids
- Use batch actions to enter data for your Choice students
- If a student leaves your school, enter their Exit date and type as soon as possible

- Check often on your WISEdata site to make sure that your data is coming through and that it is accurate
- Connect with your provider's support and give them readonly access to data
